



MEDICAL MARIJUANA TREATMENT CENTER Request for Inspection

A medical marijuana treatment center (MMTC) may be permitted to process the marijuana with hydrocarbon solvents or other solvents or gases exhibiting potential toxicity to humans. When processing with such solvents or gases exhibiting potential toxicity to humans, an MMTC must comply with the requirements set forth in the Rule 64-4.209, F.A.C., Low-THC and Medical Marijuana Solvent Based Extraction and Related Products.

Prior to processing with any solvent, an MMTC must submit a request to the Department of Health, Office of Medical Marijuana Use (OMMU). Submit this completed request form to OMMULicenseOperation@flhealth.gov.

Upon receipt of the completed request form, the certification from the engineer, the approval from the local fire code official, and the standard operating procedures to include employee training plan, the OMMU will inspect the MMTC's facility(ies) and operations. After completion of the inspection, the OMMU will send written notice to the MMTC either permitting the MMTC to use solvents during processing or identifying any omissions, deficiencies, or violations.

An MMTC may not begin processing with any solvent prior to receiving approval from the OMMU.
